Every Educator is central to the RtI process. The processes associated with the Response to Intervention (RtI) movement mean that educators need to improve or develop new skills and strategies. This workshop presents a systematic approach to collaborative problem-solving, for all school personnel, that is grounded in realistic and practical solutions.

Problem-solving can be viewed in a three-tiered framework that takes place throughout the school environment, so there will be an emphasis on understanding how the steps of problem solving fit into various school structures.

In this **hands on session** there will be coaching, practice and planning and more instruction during this workshop so that participants leave with improved skills and a direction for how they can help their team move forward in using problem solving to improve outcomes for students.

This workshop will provide **clarity using case studies** highlighting familiar and realistic scenarios. Guided practice will help to illustrate the varied roles and skills needed to be a problem-solver at a highly effective, professional level.
